## **A MUST-SEE**

An extensive black and white print exhibit, entitled "Migrations," by Sebastiao Salgado at the Berkeley Museum is truly worth the trip (until March 24). A Brazilian, Salgado began his career as an economist, converting to photography in 1973. Today he is probably the foremost photojournalist in the world and has been justly recognized by the photographic community.

In this poignant exhibit, he has captured the tragedies of wars — families driven from homes, inmates of refugee camps, orphan homes, hunger, and deprivation, thousands marching to somewhere else. Most of the photos were taken recently and it is affecting that there are so many places on earth that are simultaneously suffering the results of conflict.

His use of lighting is remarkable; he is an artist in the darkroom. Every person, even in large groups, has special light on them or about them. His use of eyes to communicate culminates in an extraordinary collection of portraits of refugee children.

# DIGITAL CAMERAS COME OF AGE

Someone recently predicted that this year will be the last year that film reigns supreme. From now on it will be downhill for film-based cameras and uphill for digital ones. Why? Because digital cameras finally have achieved a resolution and ease of use that rivals its traditional predecessors. Still expensive are the serious digital cameras

such as the D1 by Nikon which can use all the Nikon lenses. However, digital cameras with 2 - 5 megabyte resolutions are now available with 7 - 10x lens ranges (38 - 380 mm equivalent). These could become your backup cameras as they are lightweight and easy to carry and immune to airport X-ray machines.

**Olympus C-700 Ultra Zoom** (lists for \$470 new on eBay) with a 10x zoom capability. Its 2x resolution is lower than I would like, but with interpolation packages such as Genuine Fractals, some free for download, it would be possible to blow up your final print size to 11" x 14" without much loss of definition. It has an electronic viewfinder useful for macro work.

Nikon Coolpix 5000 - \$785 eBay price new. A high 5 megapixel resolution, but only a 3x zoom lens (28-85 eauivalent). Shutter speeds of 8 secs to 1/4000 sec. Produces sharp 8" x 10" prints with no interpolation, but, again, much larger acceptable prints can be obtained with Genuine Fractals. All auto to full manual controls, built-in flash plus a flash accessory shoe.

It also sports accessory lenses to increase the range including a 19 mm equivalent, white-balance bracketing, saturation control and a Quick Review button so you can see your last shots while still in the shooting mode.

Canon Power Shot \$40 (\$610 listed new on eBay): 4.0 megapixels with 3x optical zoom, movie mode with sound and voice memo. 1/1.8 inch 4 megapixel charge coupled devise (CCD), 35 - 105 mm equivalent; 11x digital zoom (larger but resolution poorer.

**Minolta Dimage 7** (\$750 listed new on eBay): 5.24 megapixels, 2/3-type CCD, 28-200 mm equivalent, f 2.8, 30 secs to 1/2000 sec, built-in flash, accessory shoe for flash, PR,S,A, and M modes, additional accessories available.
