

SOME THOUGHTS ON "CREATIVE"

Previously entitled the Contemporary Division, the Creative category has been lifted from the depth of techniques to the heights of imagination with its new definition.

Think!

"Creative" can mean anything from a set of yellow squashes with painted faces dressed up in doll clothes to your pet reflected in mylar. The key word is "creative." Avoid chichés!

Previsualize the image you'd like to make. Have a brainstorming session to elicit ideas — with yourself — or better, with a spouse or a friend. During exercise, think of concepts. Look at what others in the field are doing, go to museums for inspirations. Peruse print and TV ads. It never hurts to try a variation of what someone else has already thought of, but please don't copy it exactly!

When you come up with a great concept, be sure to write it down. "Brain drain" has more than one meaning.

Then, put the concepts together — in the camera, on the desktop, in the darkroom, or with the computer.

If using the computer, don't feel constrained to working with filters — your previsualized concept could take a little effort, requiring several shots that you need to combine for the final image, but how much better it will fit the category!

Be aware that the new category has limited the use of computer created artwork since it requires that your final presentation begin with a photograph. Presumedly, this would rule out the use of fractal designs, personal artwork and clip art. This is an area of contention that may emerge for future discussion. Why restrict anything???

Your output can look perfectly usual in all aspects but be awash in imagination. I think that this is what it's all about.

Don't forget the opening words of the new definition which are perhaps the most important of all: "Creative photography is producing an image through the use of imaginative skill or originality of thought..."

Among the topics discussed:

Charlie Patterson of Livermore Valley Camera Club has been officially appointed as the 2002 **N4C secretary.**

Secretary's Report: The updated delegates roster was passed out at the meeting. The camera club judges list is also in process of being updated. Of the original 56 names, 8 have resigned and 12 more need to be contacted.

Treasurer's Report: There are still details to be taken care of with the new account as a result of the attempted theft by forgery from N4C. The judges fees have been paid. Cash assets are \$6957.70 as of 3/31/02. Glenn Corlew presented the proposed budget for 2002. The estimated income falls short (\$2790 including the \$1000 usual profit-share from FotoClave) by \$803 of the estimated expenses of \$3,593. The budget was approved.

Vice-President's Report: Several hotels and/or restaurants have been contacted for the Annual Luncheon. The best price is still the Emeryville Holiday Inn, so Joan Field will continue working with their catering service. We will be able to get the same room and facilities for Sunday, January 13. Joan urged delegates to start thinking about raffle prizes now.

To help gap the budget drain, N4C proposes to run a **special day-long presentation** by a well-known photographer as a fundraiser. Joan, Mary Asturias and Keith Marsh are on the com-

mittee to research costs and availabilities. Names mentioned include: Richard Martin who made an inspiring presentation of photos taken in Cuba and the last FotoClave, DeWitt Jones, Art Wolfe, Michael Sewell, John Shaw and others.

The **Audit Committee** will meet next month.

Foto Fanfare: We are trying to get photos that will date-match the winners appearing in the Fanfare. Charlie Patterson will mail three photos to Joan Field for scanning. The photos will then be returned at the next board meeting which is the normal time for such return, thus avoiding any holdover of slides. Slides or prints will be chosen that will reproduce well in black & white as well as color.

Glenn Corlew was looking for a replacement for Fran Cox, who is leaving the area, as secretary to the **Yerba Buena PSA Chapter**. (Glenn has informed me that Joan Beall of Contra Costa Camera Club has accepted. *-editor*)




