

DIGITAL PROJECTION III

This area still astounds, amazes and confuses most of us. The least controversial and universally accepted use is to project a slide show, preferably in Slides to Music format. It totally absolves the need for expensive/unwieldy dissolve units and two- or three-projector shows. How much easier to carry a CD!

Some of the recommended programs for producing these shows are:

(1) The redoubtable **PowerPoint.** Advantages: Can set a specific # of seconds timing for each slide so that it is possible to match the music more closely. Has a fair number of transitions to choose among, however, you cannot do a true fade from one slide to the next. Still a clunky program, it can import only one slide at a time. If using several music tracks, the transitions are not smooth. This can be overcome, however, with a number of

music programs that can be used to combine tracks with either cross-fading or fade in-fade out. [For both Macs and PCs] Comes as part of Microsoft Office (\$399).

(2) SmoothShow [Windows only] This is highly recommended by some of the PSA digital experts and Tim Gray of Lepp Associates. One advantage is that you can download all the images in one operation. Like PowerPoint, it has a "Slide Sorter" format. It has two audio tracks, one that represents tracks attached specifically to a slide and the other that will play in the background throughout the slide presentation. The light edition sells for under \$20, but you need the pro edition for audio synchronization (\$69.95). You can try it out free for 30 days by downloading from the website: www.smoothshow.com.

(3) iPhoto (Macintosh only). The new version of iPhoto allows you to move slides around in the slide viewer provided they are in albums which you can easily create. It lacks the complexity of either of the two programs above in that you cannot change the per slide timing, nor can you specifically set up the musica to match the slides. You can now, however, use any music from iTunes, whereas previously you could only access the music that came with it. It is perfect for presenting separate slides during LCD projection at camera club competitions. Simply by tapping the space bar you can stop or continue the show at a given slide. It is also easy to sort slides on the computer and highlight only those slides you would like to present as the winning slides.

More about music in the March edition. Some useful programs are Cacaphony and Jam of Toast & Jam. Also Bias. The first two are Mac only.

published in many books and magazines including National Geographic, Audubon, Birder's World, Discover, Smithsonian, and Wildlife Conservation Magazine.

Roy's natural talent for blending humor and stage presence with photography/wildlife education was finely tuned in roles as a San Diego Wild Animal Park educator, museum curator, elementary school teacher, and as a frequent guest speaker at photographic conferences and camera clubs. He continues to serve as a volunteer rovina naturalist at California's Año Nuevo State Reserve (elephant seal rookery).

Today Roy shares his love for teaching photography by regularly instructing photographic tour groups and workshops in the field. His most recent Rainforests of Costa Rica workshop was filmed for television and will air on a program called Fantasy Camp to appear on the Fine Living Network (Spring, 2004). When he is not in the field, Roy offers his popular "Shoot Like the Pros" http://www.toftpho- to.com/weekend.htm> weekend workshop series from his home-based studio on the scenic northern California coast, just south of San Francisco.

Roster information sheets were distributed. Please be sure to get the updates to Trenkins McClain who is our new secretary.

Treasurer: Checking account balance is \$2497.68 plus \$4294.80 in trust account at end of December. Banquet income was \$3467 including \$516 from the raffle. Holiday Inn was paid \$3064.88 for 113 meals although there were 119 registered. The wait staff in charge at the time did nothave the authority to charge more, so we may get an additional bill. Also because there was no bar service, wine was served at the tables. \$352.50 was collected from the drinkers of about \$400 worth of opened wine bottles.

It was decided to buy 25 new plaques to cover three years of annual awards. Estimated cost: \$20 each. Our new treasurer is Donita Hohenstein.

Vice-President: The no-liquor dilemma at the banquet was dissipated to some extent by placing wine bottles for sale on the tables. The hotel should have notified us that the bar would be closed.

The new VP (Joe Hearst) requested any suggestions to make the Banquet run smoother from the delegates. A better light at podium was mentioned.

Schedule for hosting monthly judgings: February - Photochrome; April - Millbrae, June - Peninsula, August - Photochrome, October - Millbrae.

Print Clarification: As of January 2004, all color prints (commercial and self-made) are to be combined at N4C. The top three from each class will be submitted to the monthly competitions. Monochrome will continue to send two from each class. If a member club prefers to retain commercial and self-made as separate competitions they may, but only a total of three from both groups can be forwarded to the N4C competition and they will be judged together. New forms need to be designed to reflect the change.

Chairs: Do not accept slides or prints beyond the month of competition.

Foto Fanfare: Will hand out new lists for email at the next meeting.

PSA: Nature Division International needs an International Competition Chair. This is NOT the International Nature Division Chair. For more details, contact Eleanor Webster.

Budget Committee appointed: Donita Hohenstein and Glenn Corlew. **Audit Committee** appointed: Chris Kibre, Jim Deibler and Glenn Corlew.

Print Chair: Because of the large number of prints which seem to increase as more clubs compete in this area, it was moved to divide the print chairmanship. Sandy Chandler of Marin has volunteered to take half the burden from Natalie Barton.

Committee to Investigate the Possibilities of Digital Projection was formed: Eleanor Webster, Joe Hearst, Joan Field, Pat Prettie and Patricia Wilson. Joe was made chairman.
