





## **MAKING A LIST**

Trenkins I. McClain

I was asked recently about where to shoot. The question really puzzled me, and I thought to myself, Well, you shoot where you point your camera. But that was clearly not what the person had in mind. They had a weekend coming up, and they were free, and they were wondering where to go. How do you decide where to go? They obviously wanted to get out of the neighborhood, but didn't want to go too far afield.

You've heard the expression, "He's making a list and checking it twice?" Well, it's time for you to do that, if you don't know where to go this weekend. Fair weather or foul, you should have a place to go when you are free to take a ride with your camera.

There is a wonderful thing called communication, and it should definitely be used during the break at your local camera club. Besides complaining about the job the judge is doing, one of the things you might talk about to someone is where their favorite place is to photograph locally. Or if you have a subject you like to shoot, you might ask that person if they know of a place where these subjects are located. Some people like to be secretive about their places, but even if they are, they may have one that they are willing to share with you. Make a list.

I have various lists, and occasionally, I'll run across a contender for one of them. The most recent, penciled onto a bit of wrinkled napkin, that looked as if it had been used to wipe up some peanut butter read: P/A – Univ Art Supp – across st + dwn ~ 1.5 blks = bare trees DEC color on some still gd. Forms grt. Bldg prob. Incorp. Prkg lot-easy switch. Sunday gd. Wet.

What did that tell me? I had obviously had a peanut butter sandwich that day and I had seen some great bare trees in Palo Alto, across from University Arts Supply and down a bit, about a block and a half. It was near a parking lot where I had easy access to my subject and could switch my point of view to avoid some building which might be a problem unless I wanted to incorporate them into the picture. (As I recall, the buildings had interesting color to them.) The trees had wonderful forms, and some of them still

had fall color. Sunday would be a good day to do it, because the streets would more than likely be empty, and a wet day would be worth a try. I would need to put this on my December list and mark that it may be put on the list for late November and January as well.

I once saw a great shot of daffodils at the windmills in Golden Gate Park and have always wanted to see them for myself. The photographer told me when he had gone, so I went the following year at that time. They had come and gone. Following years I tried various times, but never hit it. Sometimes you get good information, but it just never works out. It's still on my list.

Another place on my spring list is the Strybing Arboretum in Golden Gate Park, San Francisco. They have a native plant section there that is a glory of color at this time of year. If you can get off during the week, it is less crowded, but is definitely worth checking out if you like flower photography.

Mark your February/March list for mustard in the vineyards. I still haven't found the perfect spot, and this year, I didn't even find the mustard! It's still on my list, but it looks like they've yanked the mustard and are using some other plants to fix the nitrogen.

Foggy? Like to do cemeteries? Make a list. Terra Linda Catholic Cemetery in Marin is a great place. It was also wonderful on a day filled with blue sky and huge puffy storm clouds. So expand your list (or at least cross reference it) to not only include time of year, but weather conditions.

Is a negative tide coming at a reasonable hour? Head out to your favorite tide pool area (Fitzgerald Marine Reserve, Moss Beach). Surf up? Head out to a favorite rocky area or a surfer beach. Bird nesting time? Find a tree with a hole in it and see if it is occupied by anything you can capture. Bird migrations? Head out to the valleys and the various bird refuges. Is your list getting longer?

Then there is the entry TTs nxt/nr f/sta+ch. If anyone can decipher that, please call. I'd love to add it to my list. It sounds like a good place to be this weekend.

## SAVE THE DATE FotoClave 2007

Sponsored by N4C, 6Cs and San Joachin Valley Council November 2 - 4 Sheraton Gateway Hotel, Burlingame

Friday evening's speaker will be **Stephen Scott Patterson**, a well-known Canadian photographer of the Freeman Patterson (no relation) school. He is a pictorial and fine art photographer who has studied under Ernst Haas.

Sunday morning promises a two-hour presentation by the expert nature photographers **Kennan and Karen Ward**. Kennan, a photographer, videographer and adventurer-naturalist, has written several books about wilderness and wildlife. He has dedicated his life to capturing the rare forms of nature first on film, now digitally. From an endangered rhinoceros, to a heart-melting glance from a grizzly cub, to a threatened elephant, to tribal drummers extinct within a year, to a split-second burst of illuminating lightning, Kennan continues to explore remote regions of the world to bring back messages of uncommon beauty.

Saturday daytime presenters include **Claudia Peterson** of 6Cs, who will show us how she sets up her incredibly impactful still-life photography

and **Joe Hearst**, of Contra Costa and Livermore Valley Camera Clubs, who looks to common objects to produce both compositionally-strong and colorful images, His title is called: "Rust, Rubbish and Reflections: Finding Unusual Compositions in Unlikely Places."

**Trenkins McClain,** is an instructior and expert in abstract macro photography and her email address gives us her presentation's bias: "seesmacro."

Also **Rex Morey** of Livermore Camera Club will present the latest ways to produce panoramas, the use of multiple images for greater depth of field and High Dynamic Range Techniques (HDR) in Photoshop.

## SOME OF THE BEST THIRD PARTY CORRECTION PROGRAMS

On the Huntington Witherill workshop in San Juan Bautista, he reminded us of his recommendations given at the San Mateo seminar. Of the most desirable programs **to correct digital NOISE** he recommends **Imagenomic's Noiseware Professional**, which sells for about \$70 and has been shown to work better than the other noise reduction programs on the market today.

It received the Editor's Choice 2006 Imaging software award from *American PHOTO*: "A must-have Photoshop plug-in for controlling and reducing image noise... Powerful, easy to use, intuitive interface, excellent results."

MacWorld gives it a 4 1/2 mice: "Noiseware is one of those products that can be incredibly easy and fast to use, or one in which you [can] spend a lot of time tweaking within the plug-in."

**For increasing the size of an image** for printing, he recommends **SI Pro 2**, which he believes is better than either the Photoshop interpolation (Image Size) or Genuine Fractals.

**The new SI Pro 2 plug-in** by Essential Darkroom (about \$25) "gives photographers access to powerful and flexible options for customizing their own image interpolation outputs. It is the result of many months of development and based on the feedback we received from many professional photographers looking for the highest quality print output."
