## A Photographic

 Journey

I had the opportunity to join our own resident Master photographer and judge, John Goyer, on a 3 week trip to Spain last April. For many years I had longed for a trip to Spain to search for my family roots in Catalunya, but now it would be marvelous photographic journey as well.

We soon realized in our planning that to fully take in all Spain had to offer would easily take several visits. No country has more UNESCO World


Heritage sites than Spain. But John and I did pretty good in the time we had hitting Madrid, Segovia, Toledo, Sevilla (my favorite), Granada, Valencia, and Barcelona (and my grandfather's nearby hometown of Sitges). History, art, and
 architecture were at virtually every turn calling for our cameras to click away. This is a country that has known Celtic peoples, Greeks, Carthaginians, Romans, Visigoths, and Moors. It certainly shows in the sheer variety of photo subject matters. This grand cultural mix is evident at Santa Maria la Blanca in Toledo. It was a $12^{\text {th }}$ century synagogue that looks just like a mosque and is now part of the Catholic Church. The bell tower of the cathedral in Sevilla was once a minaret.

But it is not just ancient influences. It was readily apparent that Spain has been at the forefront of art and architecture with creative figures such as Dali, Picasso, Gaudi, and, today's

sensation, Santiago Calatrava (he of Sundial Bridge fame). His City of Arts and Sciences in his hometown of Valencia was certainly one of the highlights of the trip. Barcelona has to be one of the most beautiful cities l've ever seen. I remember standing with a crowd around one of Gaudi's eccentrically organic apartment buildings. Next to it was an absolutely beautiful apartment, but because of where it was it was being completely ignored. Location, location, location.

Can't wait for future trips to see
 what we missed. Bilbao in the Basque country, the Altamira cave paintings, Salamanca, Leon, Cordoba, Cuenca, Santiago de Campostela, to name a few. Exploring the countryside would be another photo adventure. Next to Switzerland, Spain is the most mountainous nation in Europe. Not to mention it's just a hop skip and a jump from Morocco. My bucket list could be filled by Spain alone.

## Presiding: John Goyer

The meeting was called to order at 7:33 pm. Roll call: $\quad$ Role call was read by Leslie Crandell. All were present with the exception of Palo Alto, Photochrome, Tom Debley, Terry Ryder, Sam Berzin, and Amory Donaldson.
Minutes: Minutes were read. Bob Strum made a motion to approve the minutes, Ed Mestre seconded the motion. The motion was carried.
President: Nothing to report.

Treasurer: Teri said that N4C's tax exempt status has been revoked. Wendell Delano has been given Power of Attorney to complete the steps necessary to reinstate our tax exempt status. The process will take about 3 months.

The rent for the church room that is used for N4C board meetings has been raised from $\$ 36.00$ to \$43.20.
Secretary: Nothing to report.
Judges Chair: Joe Hearst said that some N4C judges have requested that their pay be raised. Teri Schoech said that any changes should be for 2012. Jim Cutler made a motion to raise judges pay in 2012 to $\$ 40$ and $\$ 45$ if they are passing a bridge. Dean McCoy seconded the motion. The motion was carried.

The N4C judges for July are Joan Field for Projected Images and Bob Schmiedescamp for Prints. The judges for August are Rose Bower for Projected Images and Pat Prettie for prints. September judges are Robin Lew for Projected Images and Dan Katzman for Prints.

Joe asked permission from the board to have 9 judges for the annual judging. Permission was granted.

Joe said that we need more judges. He will send the list of all judges and interclub judges to Leslie to distribute to the board members. He would like recommendations for interclub judges from the board members.
Print Chair: Nothing to report.

El Coordinator: Gene Albright said that he hasn't received Diablo Valley's prints or projected images from last month.

Gene Albright has some annual medals that have not been distributed to the recipients yet. 4 metals are for Marin.
Foto Fanfare Editor: Amory Donaldson was not present.
PSA: Joe Hearst brought a couple of recent PSA Journals to the meeting.

There will be a PSA fall chapter event, Steve
Traudt will be speaking about Creative Photography. More details to come later.
Fotoclave: Joan Field said that Fotoclave will be $\$ 60.00$ per person and $\$ 95.00$ for couples. If the same number of people attend as last year we will make round $\$ 12 \mathrm{k}$.

Raffle for Fotoclave has not been worked out yet.

The Fotoclave committee has booked several speakers that are outside the camera clubs. John Paul Caponigro will be speaking on Saturday night about Creativity and Sunday morning he will do a workflow presentation.

Joe said that a excel form for prints will be emailed to N4C Reps to distribute.

Ed Mestre said that projected images need to be uploaded on the photo services website.

Ed said that we should set aside time at our next board meeting to organize and distribute prints. This item will be added to Augusts' agenda.

Gene Albright said that all members' entries
are due on Aug. $7^{\text {th }}$. A finalized list of projected images will be ready on Sept. $18^{\text {th }}$.
Webmaster: Not present
Jim Cutler said that he would talk to our webmaster about adding a link for photo services on the N4C website.
Old Business: The idea of revising the photo competition schedule was revisited and it was decided that Plan D was the best choice because it spreads out the competitions at the end of the year. Ed Mestre made a motion to approve, Dean McCoy seconded the motion, and the motion was carried. New Business: Jane Postiglione brought up the issue of our preamble needing to be rewritten. She said that the preamble needs to be clarified in regards to no clip art, stock, or photographs other that those made by the photographer being used in competition. We had a lengthy discussion regarding
possible solutions. It was decided that Jane would email the board a new preamble for us to discuss and decide upon.

Meeting adjourned at 8:50pm.

In this session, Sean Duggan will cover the essentials of HDR camera technique as well as provide an overview of post-capture processing using Photoshop CS5, Photomatix and Nik's HDR Efex Pro.

Sean will also cover techniques for further polishing
and fine-tuning the image after the HDR process is complete.

Route One is considered one of the most beautiful drives in the world, as the rugged and rocky coast rises from the Pacific Ocean to form the towering hills and mountains of the Santa Lucia Range.

I am interested in changing the shutter speeds to soften the motion of water and clouds, including long exposures by moonlight.
